REGISTERED NURSES OF BRITISH COLUMBIA MEMORIAL BOOK UNVEILED AT 1997 RNABC ANNUAL MEETING

A t the Registered Nurses Association of British Columbia (RNABC) Annual

Meeting 3 years ago, a resolution put forth by the History of Nursing Group was passed, which asked that the directors of RNABC develop an in memoriam book. In this book the names of RNABC members who have made major contributions to nursing and the community could be recorded. documented, and displayed. The Memorial Book would serve as an historical document that honors deceased RNABC members who de-

serve recognition for their contributions to nursing in British Columbia

For the past three years members of the History of Nursing Group have been working with RNABC to move this project forward. At the 1997 Annual Meeting the Memorial Book will be unveiled for the first time and on display for public viewing. The first eight recognized nurses have been selected and their photographs, biographical data and contributions to nursing entered in the book, (see page 2).

The History of Nursing Group is responsible for obtaining nominations each year for the Memorial Book. Nominees must have been registered in British Columbia and practiced nursing in the province. The nominee must have made a significant contribution to nursing. Specific indicators have been developed which are diverse in nature. Nominations should include full name, dates, a 250 word account of the nominee's contributions, other supporting information and a photograph.

All nominations are

welcome. Names will be put forward each year but all names will be retained and submitted in subsequent years. The deadline for submission is in the spring and will be published in Nursing B.C. All nomination materials should be sent to the History of Nursing Professional Practice Group, c/o RNABC, 2855 Arbutus St., Vancouver, B.C. V6J 3Y8.

The History of Nursing Group hopes that nurses across the province will submit nominations and participate in the preservation of their nursing heritage.
