A brief word of introduction from the board members:

AGM Reports 2022-2023 - presented and approved at the AGM, April 11, 2023

The Board of Directors has met six times since the last Annual General Meeting and also several members were able to visit the Military Museum with Adrian French in May. The various committees have continued to carry out their activities and our meetings have been enhanced by a variety of speakers. At the November meeting, the members present took part in a survey from the Canadian Heritage Department, Government of Canada to assist in the modernization of the National Museum Policy.

Also thanks to Lenore Radom who works with the printer and facilitates the mailing of newsletters for those who do not have e-mail and Lynne Esson who sends out the newsletters electronically. I would like to express my sincere thanks and appreciation to all who contribute information and articles for the newsletter.

Editors for 2022: Winter: Membership renewal/Presidents message mailed out by Lenore Radom; spring, summer and fall issues: Lynne Esson. *Costs*: Overall, the costs for the printing and mailing of the newsletter for 2022 is approximately \$723 dollars. Anita Peterson for the two newsletters received an honorarium in total of \$400 dollars. Cassidy Mantle design and graphics for the fall newsletter was 747. 50. Total Newsletter and Membership renewal (winter mail out) costs for 2022 were approximately 1,870.50. Future Plans: We will continue to issue 3 newsletters per year with the winter issue being replaced by a special membership mailing.

Archives Committee Report, by Nan Martin, Archives Committee Chair

- The UBC-V office held by the BCHNS is tidy and welcoming for visitors and donors. We have no
 contract archivist now but our previous archivist, Francis Mansbridge, may use the office while
 writing the BCHNS History project. I check into the office regularly, so our presence is noted and
 appreciated at the UBC-V School of Nursing.
- Nan met with Krisztina Laszlo on June 28,2022. She informed everyone that the BCHNS Archival Holdings have been successfully processed by Marion Arnott and made fully available for researchers and the public. Search the UBC Library website to view the BC History of Nursing Society listing: The entire archival collection of the BC History of Nursing Society was transferred in March 2022 to the University of British Columbia Library Rare Books and Special Collections. The Society fonds includes information on individual nurses, nursing groups, the UBC School of Nursing, biographical files, oral histories, photographs, reference material. - With Lenore and Beth, Nan made necessary wording changes on the website to reflect the transfer
 of our paper documents as well as our collection of graduation pins and insignia to the UBC Library
 Rare Books Special Collections.
- An interesting acquisition in October was a nursing cap and carrying case. With Lenore's help, we found a blog site oldfoolrn and, lo and behold, on the cupcake page, there it was! It was from the Mack School of Nursing, St Catherine's General and Marine Hospital, Niagara, Ontario the first Nightingale style hospital in Canada 1874. I informed the donors.
- Several other new acquisitions included a 1970s Public Health dress and hat, two uniform sets from UBC 1935 and RJH 1958. Francis Mansbridge was hired for a few hours to accession these items on our computer and Finding Aids.

Nan and Glennis Zilm attended the **2022 Conference of the BC Historical Federation Annual Conference (BCHF)** on behalf of the BCHNS, June 2 - 5. The conference theme was "Memory," in reference to the BCHF's 100th year anniversary (founded in Victoria, in 1922). Nan reports:

Co-hosted by the Victoria Historical Society, the annual conference was delivered in an online format over four days once again this year. Like the 2021 virtual conference, over 100 delegates from member societies around the province settled down to an awesome selection of presentations and the celebration of the Awards Gala!

All sessions were recorded and will be available for viewing on the BCHF's you tube channel. Two of the sessions were particularly moving as they presented a new perspective on the uprooting and dispossession of Japanese Canadians and the accession of Residential School Records.

At the Awards Gala, Dr. Keith Thor Carlson, presented the keynote speech: "History as a Tool for

Reconciliation." Of special note, Dr. Keith Thor Carlson and Dr. Albert "Sonny" McHalsie (Naxaxalhts'l) received the inaugural Advocacy Award. The Lieutenant Governor's Medal for Historical Writing was won by Barry Gough for Possessing Meares Island. Thanks to BCHF for a wonderful conference filled with passionate and inspiring speakers. Pages of History Report, by Lenore Radom

On April 21, 2022 Sheila Zerr called a meeting to organize an official binder with all the website pages of history collected for the website & consents, that will at some point be added to the original and official album records that were submitted to Archives in 2009. These were then included in the transfer of artefact items to UBC Library of Rare books and Special Collections.

Displays Committee report, by Linda Quiney, Chair

Members: Linda Quiney (Chair), Nan Martin

We are happy to welcome the return of physical displays in the hallway of the UBC Nursing School. We have been well supported through 2022/2023 by Dr. Lydia Wytenbroek's talented students who have provided two extremely timely and stimulating displays based on their research. Photographs of the respective displays can be found on the BCHNS website under the Displays link.

In February of 2022, a display celebrating the history of Black nurses was installed by UBC-V doctoral student Ismalia DeSousa, aided by BSN students Tamasha Hussein, Kelly Nguyen, Ariel Tzu-Han Chou, Brandon Moeller, and Merielle Moffat. This included a 60-minute virtual walkthrough on Feb. 14, to initiate the display. The display was left in place through October 2022.

On October 27th, 2022, throughout the remainder of the fall term, a Remembrance Day display was installed to representing Canadian military nursing from the First World War through the present day. Within the display was an acknowledgement of the lack of racial and ethnic diversity within the military nursing ranks prior to the current era of recognition.

On November 8th, 2022 the 10th Annual Nursing History Symposium was held, in-person again after the Covid-19 pandemic. It took place at the Cecil Green Park House on the UBC campus, and we mounted a small display on the theme of Public Health Nursing in Canada. It was developed in reference to the topic of the keynote presentation by Dr. Esyllt Jones from the University of Manitoba on the history of public health and pandemics in Canada.

In early 2023, Nan Martin and I installed a display on the topic of Amelia Douglas, the province's first known Indigenous nurse. The display included a replica dress, bonnet and decorated leather chatelaine from the BCHNS collection to commemorate the work of Amelia Douglas. In April, a display, titled "Chinese Canadian Nurses in BC: A Historical Perspective" was recently mounted by Lieza Phan, MSN graduate, with Dr. Wytenbroek. The display highlights Lieza's MSN research and presents a new topic for BC Nursing History. We urge you to drop by if possible, or view the photo posted on the website under the Displays link.
