## **President's Report**

At the 2023 AGM, members made an important decision about the future of the BC History of Nursing Society. Members passed the motion that the BC History of Nursing Society would not be dissolved in 2024, as was previously considered and a new board was elected. With that, we moved forward over the past year, set new goals, and moved ahead with events, meetings and as always, ongoing updates on our website. I truly must acknowledge the valuable work of Lenore Radom, for always keeping us on track and being the living memory of the ins and outs of the organization. In setting new goals, we kept in mind the overall goal of the BCHNS, that is, to discover, disseminate and preserve nursing history.

The Board of Directors has met seven times since the last Annual General Meeting. In three of these, members participated and in which we had an invited speaker. The various committees have continued to carry out their activities. Of note is the work of the Bursary Committee, which Marg Scaia and Linda took on this year, and revised and updated the bursary application process. We are very pleased to have received applications this last March which are currently in review. Other committee work of note is the archival committee. Nan Martin and Suzanne Nixon collaborated in looking after the archival material, particularly the artifacts, with help and input as well from Wendy Trigg and Linda Quiney in setting up displays. Also of note is the work of the website, communication, and newsletter committee. The former newsletter committee handed over the torch to a new group, and we gratefully acknowledged their longstanding contributions in the last newsletter. Thanks again!

Lenore and Beth reminded us of the need to have a look at the future and functionality of our website. We need to keep up with it, so a website sub-committee was formed, and we met with Anita Petersen, who is hosting our website through their *ThinkTechnica* company. In our open Forum today, we will have a chance to have some further discussion about the website, but the bottom line is that in order to keep the site and its platform safe and functional in the future we need to look at a thorough update of our website, a service Anita's company is able to provide. The website is an essential communication tool of our organization. ## **Bursary Report**

- ❖ In 2023, we awarded one bursary to Alistair White for his project; The Complex Role of Public Health Nurses in the Yukon, 1945-1990.
- ❖ In 2023, we updated the bursary application forms on our website to allow for electronic submission. An email was sent out to Schools of Nursing on Feb. 14<sup>th</sup>, 2024 to solicit interest and the potential for new applications for the bursary. At the March 5, 2024, board meeting, it was decided to expand our scope from nursing students only, to all students interested in the History of Nursing in BC. The application form will be adjusted accordingly. We anticipate new, and likely more applications in 2024.

# **End of Reports**

## **BC Historical Federation Annual Conference**

Chilliwack May 4, 2024

Wendy Trigg and I were pleased to represent the BC History of Nursing Society as delegates at the one-day event that featured the Federation's Annual General Meeting, a keynote presentation, a guided bus tour of the Sto:lo homelands and an award gala dinner in Chilliwack, BC, on the unceded traditional territory of the Sto:lo people. Wendy attended the AGM and keynote presentation via zoom, and I attended the full conference in person.

The keynote presentation centered on masking and unmasking Sto:lo place names, delivered by Dr. Keith Carlson, Canada Research Chair in Indigenous and Community-Engaged History at the University of the Fraser Valley and Director of the Peace and Reconciliation Centre, and Dr. Siyemiya Albert "Sonny" McHalsie, Cultural Advisor (Historian) at the Sto:lo Research and Resource management Centre, and instructor at the University of the Fraser Valley.

In the three-hour cultural bus tour, conference participants learned of original indigenous place names, ancient stories, and personal and family histories that give shape to Sto:lo culture, history, and people.

BCHF awarded the Lieutenant Governor's Medal for historical writing to Jennifer Bonnell, author of *Stewards* of *Splendour: A History of Wildlife and People in British Columbia* at the BCHF award gala dinner.
