



COPYRIGHT REGULATIONS

Reproduction of BC History of Nursing archival material is subject to the terms and conditions of the Canadian Copyright Act.

Where possible the BCHNS holds copyright over materials under its control and custody. The Archivist will assist researchers in determining the copyright status / ownership of materials in its holdings. In some cases, copyright resides with the donor and or with his / her estate. In such cases permission to copy and use must be obtained by the researcher.

Copyright ownership and status is a highly complex area. Researchers should allow adequate time for researching ownership and obtaining permission to copy, publish or exhibit. It is the sole responsibility of the researcher to ensure that Canadian copyright terms and conditions have been followed.

When copyright ownership of materials resides with BCHNS, proper citation and acknowledgement must be given to BCHNS.

Materials copied for the use of the researcher must not be recopied nor deposited in any other archive.

Researchers must complete the BCHNS Archives Research Application and the Photocopy forms. BCHNS is required to keep a record of all requested materials.
